Dear Members and Friends of Webster UCC, Congregational!



"The trees are getting bare, but it still stays warm. There is the smell of burning leaves; of woodfires in the house... This month of Thanksgiving will indeed be one of gratitude to God. For health, for work to do, for the opportunities given us of service; we are deeply grateful, and it is a feeling that makes the heart swell with joy."

If you know me well, you know that I truly believe that the entire month of November should be dedicated to giving thanks. A month of Thanksgiving! Even in the midst of a global pandemic, there is so much for which to give thanks, that it should take the whole month to do so!

The excerpt at the top of the page is from the writings of Catholic social activist, Dorothy Day. It was featured in the November 1936 edition of The Catholic Worker magazine. And I particularly like this excerpt, since Day refers to *"This month of Thanksgiving will be one of gratitude to God."* Exactly what I believe!

Another wonderful piece of writing from the author, Elizabeth Barrett Browning, comes from a blessing she wrote to a friend in 1869 following the sharing of a community Thanksgiving dinner at Union Theological Seminary:

*"Blessed are you, O God,
Creator of the Universe,
who have made all things good
and given the earth for us to cultivate.
Grant that we may always use created things gratefully
and share your gifts with those in need."*

This piece speaks to me in the line that ends: *"...and share your gifts with those in need."* Isn't that what it means to BE THE CHURCH – the Body of Christ – at this time of year? Sharing? With those in need?

Finally, I share with you a prayer from the writings of Miriam Therese Winter, a nun of the Medical Mission Sisters. Sr. Miriam earned her Ph.D. in liturgical studies at Princeton in 1983 and has written many liturgical works and hymns, some of which are in our New Century Hymnal. This Thanksgiving prayer is from her book: "WomanWisdom," 1991:

*"It would have been enough
if You had simply given life to us,
but You also gave us meaning
and liberty
and love.
How shall we respond
to such an outpouring of blessing,
except to give back life for Life
and love for unending Love."*

In this "month of Thanksgiving," the holiday celebrated by all faiths, I hope that you might take some time to pause and give thanks. Use one of these blessings or one from your own traditions. But please give thanks to the One who has given us so much!

"Now thank we all our God with heart and hands and voices..."



Frequently Asked Questions

What is a pledge to the Webster United Church of Christ?

A pledge is a commitment to provide a certain amount of money in the upcoming year to use towards church activities.

Who sees the amount of my pledge?


Pledge amounts are kept confidential and only the Financial Secretary has access to the information for tracking and processing purposes. Individual pledge information is not shared with anyone else - including the staff or Leadership Council.

Do I have to pay my pledge all at once?

No. If you pledge an amount of money for the upcoming year, that money can be paid all at once or throughout the entire year. Whatever works best for you and your budget.

What are the pledges used for?

Operating a church costs money. Pledge funding helps pay expenses including: staffing, building, grounds, and other church activities.



How is a pledge to the church different from when I make donations to specific church activities and causes?

A pledge from our congregational members is counted on as church revenue for budget purposes. Throughout the year, there are activities and mission opportunities that are not a part of the budget. These are times where additional donations are helpful and appreciated.

If I don't fill out a pledge but put money in the basket every week, isn't that the same thing?

All donations are greatly appreciated. The difference between a pledge and a spontaneous weekly donation is that a pledge allows us to have an idea of how much money to expect from our members to use towards the budget to ensure that all of the programs we have can continue.


Through the Caring Community Virtual Concerts...


