...And welcome to the beginning of Lent!

With all that has gone on in our busy lives since Advent and Christmas, we are coming to you in a JANUARY-FEBRUARY edition of "The Congregationalist" this year! Time kind of got away from us – and I was recovering from a second knee surgery, necessitating an adjustment in how we bring you the news of the United Church of Christ, Congregational of Webster.

First off, we are a couple weeks into the New Year – 2021 was supposed to rescue us from the throws of the pandemic that engulfed 2020 and made it a year we surely want to forget. The season of Lent comes as a calling forth out of the winter of our being – the cold, dormant, almost lifeless places, and into a re-imagining of our relationship with God and what it means to be a follower of Jesus.

So... once again I wish you a Happy New Year, Happy Valentine's Day, and a blessed journey through the season of Lent. And may God continue to bless us – every one!



Frequently Asked Questions

What is a pledge to the Webster United Church of Christ?

A pledge is a commitment to provide a certain amount of money in the upcoming year to use towards church activities.

Who sees the amount of my pledge?


Pledge amounts are kept confidential and only the Financial Secretary has access to the information for tracking and processing purposes. Individual pledge information is not shared with anyone else - including the staff or Leadership Council.

Do I have to pay my pledge all at once?

No. If you pledge an amount of money for the upcoming year, that money can be paid all at once or throughout the entire year. Whatever works best for you and your budget.

What are the pledges used for?

Operating a church costs money. Pledge funding helps pay expenses including: staffing, building, grounds, and other church activities.



How is a pledge to the church different from when I make donations to specific church activities and causes?

A pledge from our congregational members is counted on as church revenue for budget purposes. Throughout the year, there are activities and mission opportunities that are not a part of the budget. These are times where additional donations are helpful and appreciated.

If I don't fill out a pledge but put money in the basket every week, isn't that the same thing?

All donations are greatly appreciated. The difference between a pledge and a spontaneous weekly donation is that a pledge allows us to have an idea of how much money to expect from our members to use towards the budget to ensure that all of the programs we have can continue.

Moderator Update



Here's what's happening with the REBEL BEAT YOUTH GROUP & the SUNDAY SCHOOL KIDS

The Rebel Beat youth continue to be the hands feet and heart of Jesus by loving their neighbors through multiple ministries.

OUTDOOR PANTRIES:

The youth built the two pantries outside the east end of the church building to provide food, clothing and other supplies to our neighbors in need. Anyone is welcome to help themselves to the contents. ALSO our church family and community are welcome to donate items to the pantries. You could place the items directly in the pantries or in "Bench 2" outside the west entrance and the youth will place your donation in the pantry for you

DANIEL GERARD MILESTONES MINISTRY AT WEBSTER UCC:

A large donation of items from a Christmas gift drive by Meghan and CW Gregory have been used to help families in need since December 23, 2020. This donation of toys, clothing and groceries compelled the youth to create a proper indoor stockroom for all incoming donations. This will help us be good stewards of all the donations we receive. Shelving was also anonymously donated and we are getting our new space organized. The DANIEL GERARD MILESTONES MINISTRIES grew out of the generosity of the community. Through MILESTONES, the youth will provide birthday gifts, school backpacks, Easter baskets, Christmas gifts etc. to the grandchildren served through Rochester Advocates for Children. For example, the child receives a gift on her birthday and the grandma will receive a party bag with a cake mix, frosting, oil and eggs. Grocery bags will continue to be given to the grandmas on the holidays. We are hoping to eventually find a way for MILESTONES to serve families in the Webster Community on birthdays and holidays. Monetary donations can be given to MILESTONES MINISTRY through memorials and special gifts. Ask Carl or Colleen.

COMMUNITY GARDEN:

It may be only January but the youth are making plans for the garden. For example collecting rain-water for an irrigation system and adding a pumpkin patch !

PET FOOD PANTRY:

Sue Speer has recently spent considerable time in both the dog and cat rooms *deep deep* cleaning and checking expiration dates. The youth are quite appreciative of her hard work. Sue also purchased a shop vac for the pantries. THANK YOU SUE!! The youth continue to fill orders for Meals on Wheels and are planning a drive up dry dog food giveaway for our neighbors on Sunday January 31 11:00 am to 1:00 pm in the church parking lot.

Speaking of pet food... we unexpectedly joined in a partnership with the City of Rochester and CHEWEY. We received a donation from CHEWEY of 20 palletes of pet food and pet food supplies. We will access this new inventory to help fill our orders for MEAL ON WHEELS and to help meet the needs of community members who contact us for help. The City of Rochester will also access the pet food for their pet shelters and for periodic pet food giveaways in Rochester. Thank you to both these organizations for joining our humble pet food pantry in helping Pets in Need.

While all this happens, the youth continue to plan their strategies for being the hands feet and heart of Jesus in the world. And what about the kids at WUCC? Well they are learning about Jesus and how to follow in his footsteps in their lives at home, school and in their community. The kids also are able to participate in all these ministries. The kids have great ideas and great big hearts too ! The kids are pretty amazing at experiencing one of Jesus' stories on our Sunday zoom and immediately translate that story message into something they can do to be Jesus in the world.


