

From Our Interim Minister



Dear Ones,

During our work together in this transition phase, we have invited and encouraged all of your questions. Pastoral transitions inevitably bring anxieties to the surface, but as we seek to create a sustainable financial structure, we have elicited more uncomfortable feelings than usual. Our collective desire for Webster UCC is that it have a sound future and a stable presence in the community, and for this to happen some important choices must be made.

One choice is that we engage with truth. I've heard a couple of interesting rumors of late about the church's indebtedness (there is none), that we are out of money (we are not), and that we are on the brink of closing (absolutely not). We are not living on the brink of disaster, but we could be there in a few years without any changes.

One of those changes is now a key focus of the Search Team, namely that the pastoral search will be for a bi-vocational minister, who will be less than full time with Webster UCC and also employed in a ministry-related or unrelated second position. As we have said before, there will come a time when only the largest churches will have full time ministers. We are in good company. We are not unique. We have not failed.

As your intentional interim (transitional) minister, I have often said that I have been spending half of my time as your pastor and the other half as a transition agent. Recently I was asked about my work 30 years ago, and specifically what are things I did as a full-time minister then that I am no longer doing. It's an important question.

30 years ago, I spent far more time in hospitals, at least 2 afternoons a week, prior to HIPAA regulations. When someone was admitted they were asked religious affiliation, then the chaplain would call me. None of this is allowed now. Hospital stays were generally longer then. I still visit the hospitals upon request, but those requests are pretty rare.

Back then I usually taught an adult Sunday school class. In-home Bible studies were popular for a while, taught by the Reverend, because who else was qualified? Decades ago Church programs and activities seldom happened without me being present. I was also expected at every board and committee meeting.

"Pastoral counseling" was a constant before clergy malpractice became such a blight. People often went to their pastor instead of a therapist. So many people came, I had to put a limit on appointments. People still ask to see me for conversation, but the parameters are clear, and my goal is often to refer to other qualified professionals, depending on the need.

Culturally speaking, the church was more central to people's lives, and they expected that I would be in the office whenever they dropped by (often!) Then there was home visitation--unannounced and unscheduled—that lots of people welcomed, even expected.

The fact is, part-time pastoral ministry is the wave of the future for many positive reasons, and we can begin to see them once we realize that we are nearly a quarter of the way through the new century. The question for the present moment is not, "How can we restore our congregational past?" It is rather, "How can we maintain a vibrant, relevant ministry for the common good, using the resources that we have?"

Mental Health Sunday - June 9

On June 9 we will celebrate Mental Health Sunday, an annual observance at Webster UCC. As a WISE congregation, our intent is to openly communicate that we offer support, acceptance, and respect to each person, and to provide information and education that helps reduce the stigma around mental illness.

The scope of WISE includes, but is not limited to, anxiety, depression, eating disorders, suicide, OCD, PTSD, bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, ADHD, autism, Alzheimer's Disease, dementia, grief, substance abuse and other addictions, etc. We care about both those who may be suffering from these disorders as well as their caregivers.

Mental illnesses are among the most stigmatized health issues in our society. Myths and stereotypes abound (from <https://www.mentalhealth.gov/basics/mental-health-myths-facts>).

Myth: Personality weakness or character flaws cause mental health problems. People with mental health problems can snap out of it if they try hard enough.

Fact: Mental health problems have nothing to do with being lazy or weak and many people need help to get better. Many factors contribute to mental health problems, including:

- Biological factors, such as genes, physical illness, injury, or brain chemistry
- Life experiences, such as trauma or a history of abuse
- Family history of mental health problems

Myth: People with mental health problems are violent and unpredictable.

Fact: The vast majority of people with mental health problems are no more likely to be violent than anyone else. Most people with mental illness are not violent and only 3%–5% of violent acts can be attributed to individuals living with a serious mental illness. In fact, people with severe mental illnesses are over 10 times more likely to be victims of violent crime than the general population. You probably know someone with a mental health problem and don't even realize it, because many people with mental health problems are highly active and productive members of our communities.

Myth: I can't do anything for a person with a mental health problem.

Fact: Friends and loved ones can make a big difference. Only 44% of adults with diagnosable mental health problems and less than 20% of children and adolescents receive needed treatment. Friends and family can be important influences to help someone get the treatment and services they need by:

- Reaching out and letting them know you are available to help
- [Helping them access mental health services \(mentalhealth.gov\)](https://www.mentalhealth.gov)
- Learning and sharing the facts about mental health, especially if you hear something that isn't true
- Treating them with respect, just as you would anyone else
- Refusing to define them by their diagnosis or using labels such as "crazy"

That third fact is the core of what WISE is about. WISE is *not* about any of us pretending to provide treatment. It *is* about being supportive, providing information, advocating, and just BEING THERE for each other. It's about making our congregation a safe place where individuals can feel comfortable sharing their whole selves and can count on receiving support, not judgment.

We hope you will join our WISE team on June 9 for our service dedicated to this important topic.




In April we filled 155 purses!
