## Pastor's Note

*O LORD, you have searched me and known me... For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. (Ps. 139)*

From a recent and... at least to me... message worth repeating. From a Bridge Minister who joins you in seeking to explore new things. For what it's worth – I think you all are doing really well!

We humans skew toward liking control -- and to assuming that our solutions are sufficient to the situation at hand. And so we say “No, no, no, no, no” to people, to approaches, to ideas, to behavior that doesn't match what we think is right. And we do that on the basis of our own authority, backed up by those who agree with us and by all that is familiar... to us. After all, if its worked before, it will work again. That's what we've always done!

What if we started at “Yes”? What if “new and different” were presumed to merit exploring and potentially to be worth doing? What if our first assumption was that those with the suggestions are as smart and well-intentioned as ourselves? What if we tried stepping around to the side – not just out of the way but along-side those proposing the strange and discomfoting approach. What would it take to have us look the same way – even for just that moment – to see where our parallel views might align.

Sometimes there is more than one way to achieve a mutually desirable end. Sometimes the process that the players craft together has more value than even the outcome. Sometimes everybody learns something when we can let go of our inclinations to insist on our own way.

Where is the greater good? Was Jesus any less holy for letting his friends eat when they were hungry? Do you think he offended God by healing outside of normal office hours? (see Mark 2:23-28)

The Psalmist writes:

*O Lord, you have searched me and known me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away. You search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways... For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. (Ps. 139)*

If that's the case – if God who made us – every one of us – truly knows us and loves us, even when we're not at our best... And if God, who made us in God's own image, on purpose, with purpose and intending that we should have the freedom to make our own decisions... If THAT God strives to say “Yes” to us with forgiveness, acceptance, affirmation, and encouragement... don't you think we could try harder to do that ourselves, for one another?

In a world that RAINS RULES for everything and everyone, maybe an act of extravagant faith THIS WEEK might be to make space and let God reign. Say YES. (I meant that literally). **SAY YES.**

# WORDS FROM W.I.S.E. and ONA

## The Power of Naming

In both scripture and life, naming holds deep significance. In Genesis, God brings creation into order through naming—and invites humanity to do the same. To name something is to acknowledge its presence, its reality, and its worth. In our church communities, this act of naming is especially important when addressing topics that are often wrapped in silence or shame.

Mental illness, addiction, grief, sexuality—these are real parts of many people's lives, yet we often avoid naming them out of discomfort or fear. But when we refuse to use accurate, respectful language—like saying “depression” instead of “just feeling down,” or “gay” instead of vague euphemisms—we risk further isolating those who already feel unseen.

Naming is not about labeling—it's about truth-telling. It's about creating space where people can be honest about their stories without fear of judgment. It is an act of compassion and courage, affirming that God meets us in the fullness of who we are.

As followers of Christ, we are called to be people of light—and light shines when we name things truthfully, tenderly, and without shame. Let us be brave enough to speak clearly, overcoming our own discomfort to demonstrate the respect and inclusivity we embrace as a congregation.


