“...Now, friends, before a bunch of you stand up and walk out because you think I’m about to spout an objectionable position... and another bunch of you stand up and walk out because you think I’ll espouse the exact opposite... and the rest of you simply stare at me, aghast that I would have the audacity to do what I’ve done in church... let me assure you. I fall firmly into that last group.”

That quote is mine. From a sermon I have not yet delivered. I will say it immediately after singing, alone and unaccompanied, our national anthem. Softly. Somberly. Reverently. In low tones. On the Sunday after the 4th of July.

But I’ll stop just short of the end. In part, because folks tend to clap – an ingrained response and, in this congregation, a natural exuberance. I don’t want that for this. Because I don’t want to evoke an automatic response lest anyone feel obliged. And because the word I’ll leave out is “brave.” Followed by a question: “Are we?”

I believe the answer is yes. And, I believe, our struggle is how to embody that courage in concert with the truth of our diverse perspectives. Even in the warm embrace of our beloved church, we see things differently. Who wants to take the risk?

And yet, where better than in the warm embrace of those who know and love you, to ask hard questions? Respect is forged when we know one another. Not to force agreement. Perhaps to understand. We make idols of that which we fear to engage – too risky, too volatile, too sacred. Nonsense. We’re better than that.

Pride Parade Saturday July 19


Sign up in narthex (limited seats available for those who would rather ride than walk). Last day to order shirts and hats is July 6.






