Will you be my neighbor?

Many recall a TV show for children called Mr. Roger's neighborhood. Mr. Rogers was a kind soul. He tried to exemplify what we as caring, practicing Christians should be striving to achieve. He tried to teach children to be kind, loving, compassionate and a respectful member of society. Do you remember one of his favorite songs: "Would you be my neighbor?"

What exactly does this mean?







Words from W.I.S.E.

At the 2025 General Synod, the UCC passed a resolution encouraging more thoughtful and inclusive language when speaking about mental health. In a recent discussion, ten of us gathered to reflect on the importance of this resolution and explore how its guidance can shape compassionate, respectful conversations within our church and community. The conversation was thoughtful and heartfelt, and everyone went away having learned something.

A few notable examples of terms to be aware of include:

Common or stigmatizing term	Inclusive alternative
Committed suicide	Died by suicide, took their own life
Addict, junkie	Person in recovery Person who uses substances
He's [condition] - e.g. "He's bipolar",	He has bipolar disorder
"I'm so [condition]", used in casual language, not with respect to a diagnosis - e.g. "I'm so OCD" if you like things tidy or "I'm so ADHD" if you are distracted or "I have PTSD" if something has upset you.	Only use these terms in the context of a clinical diagnosis, and use person-centered language: "I have OCD", not "I'm OCD".

We reviewed some of our WISE materials and determined that they are generally consistent with inclusive language, but we identified some minor tweaks that we will be making in the coming weeks. The bigger challenge is to all of us to remember the importance of inclusive language every day.




