
MEETING NOTICE

LEADERSHIP COUNCIL MEETING NOTES

The church Leadership Council, people elected by the congregation to facilitate the work of the church, met on Dec. 18. The following were points of discussion and action items.

Stewardship Update—\$156,000 (83% of our goal) had been received as of that date

Budget Proposal—based on an anticipated \$60,000. **Replacement for Church Windows Software**—Discussion around the pros and cons of different software platforms and options.

Building and Grounds Updates—the Scout Troop that meets in our building would like to place a shed at the back of property, near the dumpsters. The Leadership Council approved that request, pending approval from the town and signed documentation recommended by our attorney. **Pastoral Relations Team**—In accordance with our guidance document, recommendations were made about who should make up the team and some people were "nominated" to fill the positions.

Guidance Document Amendment for signatories—Richard is working on the language to propose an amendment to the Guidance Document that would allow for people other than just the moderator to sign documents on behalf of the congregation

Woodside Updates—continuing to work to keep the lines of communication open between the church and the school. The work of the Council is not secret. Anyone can attend a meeting, and if you'd like more details regarding any of the topics mentioned here, please reach out to any Council member to ask your questions.


